Applications due March 2021

The Brian Doyle Undergraduate Marine Extension Fellowship provides a **\$3,000 stipend** over an **8-week summer project** (approximately June 1 to August 1, 2021).

Juniors and Seniors: Work with the NH Sea Grant Extension program to help individuals and organizations make informed decisions about marine resources while gaining hands-on field experience. Apply to work on our **2021 projects:**

- Shellfish Aquaculture, Public Health & Ecosystem Services
- Coastal Processes & Community Resiliency

How to Apply

Eligibility:

Undergraduate rising juniors, rising seniors, and graduating seniors from any four-year college or university in New Hampshire, and those who are New Hampshire residents (but may not necessarily attend a college/university in New Hampshire) are eligible to apply. Applicants can be enrolled in any major or course of study, and should have an expressed interest in marine science and public engagement.

Commitment:

8-week summer fellowship (approximate dates are June 1-August 1, 2021).

Stipend:

Recipients earn a \$3,000 stipend. (Equivalent to \$12/hr for 30-32 hours per week over 8 weeks.) Fellows are responsible for their own housing and transportation.

Application Materials:

Students interested in applying for a Doyle Fellowship must submit:

- **Cover Letter**
- **Resume/CV**
- **Letter of Recommendation from faculty member or advisor**

The Cover Letter should include a specific 2021 project (or projects) that the student would like to work on, as well as any particular goal(s) the applicant would like to achieve during the fellowship. 2021 projects are as follows:

1. **Shellfish Aquaculture, Public Health, and Ecosystem Services**
2. **Coastal Processes and Community Resiliency**

To apply:

Application materials received by **March 12, 2021** at 5 p.m. ET will be given priority. We will continue to accept applications through the end of March 2021.
